Historic Preservation Committee Created

At its meeting on August 10, 2015, the Seal Beach City Council unanimously adopted Resolution No. 6591, establishing a City Historic Preservation Committee for the purpose of preserving resources that represent the history and culture of Seal Beach.

The City Council recognizes the importance of historic resources and the need to preserve certain buildings having special architectural, cultural, or historical value. The Committee will be comprised of citizens representing all five voting Districts who have an interest in preserving those resources that represent the history and culture of Seal Beach. Each City Council member shall appoint one resident from his/her respective District. The Historic Preservation Committee shall serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council.

The City of Seal Beach is currently seeking applicants who are interested in serving on the Historic Preservation Committee. Persons interested in serving on the Committee are invited to submit an application to the City by Thursday, September 10, 2015 at 5 p.m. Applications are available at the City Clerk's Office at Seal Beach City Hall, 211 8th Street, Seal Beach, 90740 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Completed applications should also be submitted to the City Clerk's Office.

The Committee shall meet as deemed necessary.
