

WWII VETERAN, ALFRED ARRIETA 100TH BIRTHDAY

At the May 22nd City Council meeting, Council Members recognized WWII Veteran, Alfred Arrieta, for his 100th birthday. Alfred was born and raised in El Paso, Texas and at 19 years old he was drafted into the U.S. Army Air Corps. He completed more than 30 missions over enemy-occupied Europe as a waist gunner in a B-17 bomber. In one of his last missions, he survived a Christmas Eve crash and rendered aid to wounded crewmates. Alfred was awarded an Air Medal with Four Oak Leaf Clusters. After completing his service, Alfred owned a TV and VCR repair shop in Norwalk for many years. Alfred's legacy includes 10 children, 16 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. He lives in Leisure World with his wife, Frances.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

 A Draft Land Use Plan, the first of two major components of a Local Coastal Plan, has been submitted to Coastal Commission staff for review and comment. The public is invited to also review the document and provide feedback on the draft, which can be found on the City's website.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

- There are currently 1,301 users registered for the Senior Transportation Program. The program is available for Seal Beach residents ages 60 years and older and consists of a pre-fixed shuttle route and Yellow Cab Taxi service. FINANCE DEPARTMENT

 The City Council adopted the City's FY 2023-24 Budget, Capital Improvement Program, and Fee Schedule on May 22nd. This comprehensive budget is the result of a vear-round effort of budget development, planning, and review. Throughout the past year, the City Council conducted two strategic planning sessions to establish the priorities that serve as the foundation for the budget. Additionally, two community budget workshops were held to thoroughly examine revenues and expenditures, Citywide capital improvement projects, and discuss the budget in detail with our community. The approved FY 2023-24 Budget allocates resources for key priorities, including public safety, infrastructure maintenance, and the continuation of excellent core public services. MARINE SAFETY

- The Memorial Day weekend was overcast and less busy than normal.
 We did have a decent size south swell, which created rip currents and caused some rescues. This was great timing as we had 14 rookie lifeguards working on the towers for the first time.
- Over the last few weeks, we have held Junior Lifeguard sign-ups. This year we expanded the program to 330 kids. We currently have 225 spots filled and we're sure the last few spots will fill up quickly.

MARINE SAFETY CONT.

- Over the weekend 14 of our new Beach Lifeguards were on the towers getting some on the job training. This was their first opportunity to identify and make rescues. The rookies will get three on the job training shifts before they are staffed on the beach alone.
- New pool lifeguards are in the hiring process. We plan to hire 9 new pool lifeguards for this summer. These guards will be certified in American Red Cross Lifesaving. Once they receive the lifesaving training we will start their swim instructor training.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Both captains attended Seconds in Command training from the California Police Chiefs' Association.
- Facility Dog Yosa attended a presentation at the Seal Beach Girl Scout house.
- Working with technology vendors to improve camera infrastructure.
- Conducted meeting with all Senior Community Services Officers and Police Aides to discuss transition to animal control.
- Neighbor-4-Neighbor Block Captain meeting hosted at SPBD.
- Officers completed the Office of Traffic Safety Pedestrians and Traffic Safety enforcement for the month of May.

COLLEGE PARK WEST UPDATED FENCE LINE

Public Works maintenance staff began installing a new fence line on College Park Drive at the entrance of College Park West. The posts have been set and their foundations have been poured. NEW CHEVRON SOLAR POWERED SIGNS

New solar-nowered LFDilluminated chevron signs have been installed at the intersection of Seal Beach Boulevard and Westminster Avenue. These signs have a mounted radar that activates the blinking chevron-shaped lights when a vehicle detected, making the southbound Seal Beach Boulevard curve more visible.



UPDATED CATCH BASIN INSTALLED

A new catch basin has been installed on Seal Beach Boulevard in front of the Ayres Hotel. This new catch basin was required by the 1-405 Project contractors to help with drainage in the area.

BEST & BRAVEST AWARD RECIPIENT

Nurses and staff from the Children's Hospital of Orange County (CHOC) stopped by Fire Station 85 to show their appreciation to the firefighters who helped save an infant in March. They immediately recognized a five-day-old infant's adverse signs and symptoms, began immediate life-supporting care, and rapidly transported him to CHOC. The 5-day-old baby they helped save has a medical condition that goes into full cardiac arrest at home 75-80% of the time. They usually won't survive. CHOC says that the crew definitely played a part in saving the infant's life and bought enough time for the doctors and cardiologists to continue treatment and intervention. The patient is still recovering from the incident. The crew on the incident was Captain Patterson, Engineer Cheung, Firefighter Paramedic Bolanos, and Firefighter Paramedic Gonzalez.
