After a highly competitive process, the City of Seal Beach has selected Michael Henderson as the City's next police chief. Chief Henderson has over 30 of law enforcement vears experience, having come to the Seal Beach Police Department from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department in 2006. During his time with the



Seal Beach Police Department, Chief Henderson has worked a variety of assignments, including Captain, Patrol Sergeant, Corporal, SWAT team member, Explorer Advisor, Emergency Services Coordinator, Public Information Officer and Homeless Liaison Officer. Chief Henderson has a Bachelor's degree in Occupational Studies from California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) and a Master's degree in Homeland Security Studies from American Military University. He is a graduate of the Drucker School of Management — Executive Leadership Institute, L.A.P.D. West Point Leadership Program, and CSULB's Supervisory Leadership Institute. "Thank you to City Manager Jill Ingram, the City Council and my departmental colleagues for entrusting me with this honor," said Chief Henderson. "I am humbled to be selected as the next Chief of Police and look forward to serving and protecting the Seal Beach community in this new role."

SBPD RESPONDS TO FALSE BOMB THREAT CALL

On Sunday, November 20, 2022, at about 11:35 am, the Seal Beach Police

Department responded to a call of a structure fire at the Eaves Apartment Complex located at 333 First Street. Officers arrived on scene and quickly determined that although the fire alarm was sounding, there was no fire. Officers detained a suspicious male subject whom they believed had allegedly intentionally pulled the fire alarm.

As officers continued to check the apartment building for fire, they discovered a suspicious package directly in front of the suspicious person's apartment door. The man allegedly told officers that the package was a "gift for the bomb squad." Fearing the package contained a hazardous object, the Orange County Fire Authority and the Orange County Sheriff's Department Bomb Squad responded. Additional resources from the Los Alamitos, Cypress, and Huntington Beach Police Departments, along with the California Highway Patrol, and the Long Beach and Huntington Beach Fire Departments also responded.

Ultimately it was determined that the package did not contain any hazardous or explosive materials. The man's apartment was also checked, and officers discovered no hazardous items or other people inside.

Neighboring residents were allowed to return to their apartments.

POLICE SERVICES MANAGER RECEIVES WAYNE DALTON AWARD

Our very own Police Services Manager Michael McDonald was recently presented with California Mobility and Parking Association - Wayne Dalton Award. Michael was born and raised in Detroit, Michigan, the fourth of five children. Shortly after graduating from high school, he joined the U.S. Navy where he honorably served for 20 years until his retirement in 2004. Michael earned a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Chapman University while serving in the military. After retiring from the Navy, Michael joined the Long Beach Police Department, but an injury prevented him from fulfilling his goal of becoming a Police Officer. In 2005, Michael was hired by the Seal Beach Police Department as a part-time Police Aide in the Parking Division and was later promoted to a full-time Community Services Officer that same year. A few years later, he was promoted to Lead Community Services Officer in charge of Parking where he has proudly worked for 16 years. Most recently, in 2022, Michael has been promoted to the Police Services Manager in charge of the Parking. Detention, and the upcoming Animal Control Services Divisions. In his current role, he responds to community inquiries and supports the virtual residential parking permit program. Michael has been instrumental in troubleshooting. coordinating. managing, supporting the evolution of the parking management solution in Seal Beach. This support includes the January 2021 transition to virtual residential parking permits which was the next step to a complete platebased parking environment. The goal of this innovative approach has been to improve the parking customer's experience and incorporate more efficient enforcement practices. Michael has worked directly with all of the vendors who support the parking technology solution for the City's program. Michael is an outstanding representative of the City and the Police Department.

WINTER SAND BERM UPDATE

Construction of the winter sand berm is now complete. Work began on Monday, October 17th and was completed on Monday, November 14th.

NATIONAL POLLUTION DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM REPORT

The City completed its annual National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Report (NPDES) Program Effectiveness Assessment (PEA) report on time and submitted it to the County. The County will review all Orange County city reports and package them to submit to the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board as required by the County's permit with the State.

TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL CENTER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Tennis and Pickleball Center Improvement Project is out for bid for the construction phase. The bids are due on December 14, 2022.

GRANT APPLICATION APPROVED

Public Works staff successfully obtained a grant in the amount of \$396,000 for the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Environmental Cleanup Program. The project will include

174 Full-Capture Systems and 48 curb opening screens within the Leisure World community.

- Seal Beach continues to have warm weather and mild surf. Seal Beach had a small south swell arrive last week which gave surf in the 3-4 foot range.
- Marine Safety Department continues their work assisting California State University Long Beach Sharklab with stingray studies, where they use their Rescue Water Craft (RWC) to pull a net for the Cal State students.
- For the second year in a row the Marine Safety Department has won the public safety challenge at the Seal Beach Turkey Trot.
- This week the McGaugh pool has been closed. The week before Thanksgiving we had a large amount of water flowing on the ground from the pool heater. The heater should be repaired and back in service on Wednesday, November 30th.

A scoping meeting, which is a part of the process for the Old Ranch Country Club Environmental Impact Report (EIR), is now expected to be held in January. The meeting is one of the opportunities for the public to provide input on the environmental analysis necessary for the EIR. In compliance with State law, Community Development staff is conducting a curbside assessment of housing conditions throughout the city. The purpose of the effort is to document housing investment needs as a part of the Housing Element.
