#### **OCFA**



In the late afternoon of November 25th, 2020, Engine 44 responded to a call at Eisenhower Park from a wife who stated that her husband had started feeling unwell and rapidly deteriorated.

The engine and crew responded, arriving to the patient in just a few minutes. The crew discovered their patient in cardiac arrest and immediately began life-saving measures. Engine 44 transported the patient to Los Alamitos Medical Center and continued advanced life-saving efforts while en route.

Thanks to Station 44's actions and the care received at the hospital, the patient made a full recovery. On November 25, 2022, he paid a visit to Station 44 to celebrate what he calls his "Rebirthday." We are honored to have played a part in the full recovery of one of our local residents.

#### **PUBLIC WORKS**

- Water Conservation Undate: December 2022, the City had water savings of 14% relative to December 2020. Remember to avoid water waste and continue to reduce water use wherever possible. For water saving tips and resources, please visit our Water Conservation webnage sealbeachca.gov.
- Drought Update: In early January, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) conducted the first snow survey of the season at Phillips Station located in the Sierra Nevada. The manual survey recorded 55.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent to 17.5 inches. which is 177 percent of average for this location. The snow water equivalent measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack and is a key component of DWR's water supply forecast. Statewide the snowpack is 174 percent of average for this date. DWR is encouraging Californians to visit SaveOurWater.com for water saving tips and information, and to continue to conserve California's most precious resource, rain or shine.

### **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

- · A scoping meeting, which is a part of the process for the Old Ranch Country Club Environmental Impact Report (EIR), is now expected to be held in late February but details have not yet been finalized. The meeting is one of the opportunities for the public to provide input on the environmental analysis necessary for the EIR. Further information will be available on the City's website when the meeting has been confirmed.
- Based on action of the City Council on January 9th, staff will be establishing a short term rental program within the Coastal Zone. The program at this time will be limited to one percent of the total housing units within the Coastal Zone. More information will be made available in the coming weeks. Please stay tuned to the Community Development webpage.
- Monthly public record reports for building permits will now be posted on our website, if you are interested in seeing what type of building work is happening around town.

If you are a Seal Beach homeowner, aged 55 or older and making below the area median income, you may qualify for a grant-funded program to update your bathroom with safety features such as modified walk-in bathtubs, grab bars, and similar improvements. This program is typically limited to Leisure World, but for a short period of time, we are able to offer it citywide. # WINTER STORM UPDATES FROM PUBLIC WORKS




#### WINTER STORM PREPARATION

A series of interdepartmental coordination meetings, which included Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), were held to prepare for the events. In an effort to prepare for the anticipated winter storms, staff partnered with OCFA to reinforce the winter storm sand berms. Staff also prepared self-filled sandbag stations located at the 8th Street Beach parking lot, Marina Center, and Fire Station #44 to help residents and business owners protect personal property from mud and rain.

# **SEAL BEACH PIER DAMAGE**

The high surf and wind conditions over the weekend forced the closure of the Seal Beach Pier, which includes the boat ramp disconnection and damage to the pier's structural members. Staff has been working diligently alongside other officials and contractors to assess and repair damages to the pier. In order to ensure safety, the pier will remain closed until it has been repaired and deemed safe for use.



#### WINTER STORM MONITORING

Public Works staff has been closely monitoring the city and responded to multiple call-outs regarding downed tree and branches from the recent winter storms. Staff also quickly responded to the River's End Park basin to clear sand and debris from the basin's culvert drain into the river which was preventing it from draining.





# POLICE DEPARTMENT VOLUNTEERS SPOTLIGHT



Did you know the average full-time employee works a total of 2,080 hours a year?

In 2022, our Volunteers in Police Services (VIPS) logged a total of 14,169 hours, or the equivalent of 7 full time employees! Since the creation of the VIPS program, our volunteers have worked over 181, 053 hours!


The West County CERT Program is comprised of those who live and/or work in the communities of Buena Park, Cypress, La Palma, Los Alamitos, Rossmoor, Seal Beach, and Westminster.

The West County CERT Program's primary purpose is to educate people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact them at home, at work, or at play. The initial CERT training covers basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. With this training, CERT members can assist themselves and their families, plus others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.

CERT members give critical support to first responders, provide immediate assistance to affected individuals and organize volunteers at a disaster site. CERT members can also help with non-emergency projects that improve the safety of their community.

Sergeant Garcia was recognized on the Orange County Register's 125 Most Influential People for 2022 for the implementation of sensory kits to assist when interacting with individuals with autism.

Research shows that sensory kits can effectively increase critical communication and comfort for individuals with autism and other special needs in high-stress situations. Even during routine interactions, contact with law enforcement may be highly stressful for those with autism. The Seal Beach Police Department recently purchased sensory kits containing handheld fidgets, a weighted lap pad, noise-canceling headphones, and an inflatable balance disc.

In critical incidents, police officers may experience challenges communicating with children or adults with autism. The items in each kit are designed to help reduce the stress and confusion to the individuals and help build a rapport with the officer. The kits will be stored in patrol vehicles and will be readily available.

### SHORELINE UPDATES

Staff began development of the Spring 2023 Shoreline which covers classes offered by the City for the time period of Monday, April 3rd to Saturday, June 3rd. The Shoreline will be posted online in early February with registration beginning Monday, February 13th at 8am.
