- Prior to the Special Meeting of the **Environmental Quality Control Board** on October 11, 2022, City Clerk Harper administered the Oath of Office to the Board Members as part of the Reorganization of the Board.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT CONT.

- Preparation for Walk to School Day, and officers will be joining students as they walk to McGaugh.
- Use of the Automated License Plate Reader resulted in the arrest of a theft suspect in College Park West.
- Office of Traffic Safety 2022/2023 Grant has started. Seal Beach Police Department was awarded \$80,000 for DUI checkpoints, directed traffic enforcement, pedestrian and bicycle safety.
- Lt. Nicholas visited the Seal Beach Play Group with the Community **Oriented Policing Team and Yosa.**
- Lt. Nicholas attended Community **Emergency Response Team (CERT)** academy graduation.

### PUBLIC WORKS

- The Water Division was called out and responded to a residential water service leak in Surfside Colony. Staff quickly isolated the leak and replaced the damaged line.
- Public Works staff is continuing to work with the iWater team on integrating additional assets and tracking asset features into infraMAP.
- Public Works staff assisted Orange County Water District (OCWD) in preparing the Division of Drinking Water's (DDW) 2023-2025 Water Source and Distribution System Monitoring Waiver application.





### **PUBLIC WORKS CONT.**

• Staff installed a new tsunami evacuation sign at Windsurf Park. The sign is meant to provide visitors direction during a tsunami emergency.



- The 10th Street beach access ADA mats were temporarily removed in preparation of the annual sand berm construction.
- Staff completed a pathway of decomposed granite and installed a new memorial bench at Edison Park in College Park West.
- Maintenance staff attended a training hosted by CJPIA on basic electrical safety. The training reviewed types of energy sources, hazards, isolation procedures, use of isolation equipment, and shutdown startup procedures.

#### TRAFFIC FORUM BY ORANGE COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (OCTA)


Public Works Associate Engineer David Spitz attended the bi-annual Traffic Forum sponsored by the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA). Attendance at these forums is necessary in order to receive Measure M funding, which is used to improve intersections. coordinate traffic signals and widen streets. One of the topics that was highlighted this year included status reports on grant projects.Guest speakers also showcased new and innovative products and traffic system advances.

#### WATER RESERVOIR UPDATE

The City's water reservoirs were inspected by Dive Corr, a company that specializes in potable water tank inspections. The inspection assessed the overall condition of the exterior and interior tank coating as well as its critical components including the walls, floor, roof, inlet, outlets, and vents. The City's water reservoirs are inspected annually and are useful for detecting leaks, harmful corrosion, and sediment buildup within the storage tank.

## SAN GABRIEL RIVER BIKE TRAIL MAINTENANCE

Staff is continuing to conduct routine maintenance and cleanup along the San Gabriel River Bike Trail. Maintenance includes clearing debris, trash, and sand from the bike trail to increase pedestrian safety.



#### WINTER SAND BERM CONSTRUCTION

The City will commence construction of the annual Winter Sand Berm on October 24th

and will take three to four weeks to complete. The contractor, Crew Grading, Inc., will stage their equipment in the 10th Street beach parking lot. Public Works will have a portion of the parking lot coned off for the contractor starting on Monday, October 24th in

dogs, designated small dog area, two new drinking fountains, new signage, and new fencing.



#### ZOETER DOG PARK GRAND OPENING

The Seal Beach Recreation and Community Services Department is hosting a Grand Opening for the Zoeter Dog Park located at 12th Street and Landing Avenue on Wednesday, October 26 from 3:00pm – 5:00pm. The ceremony will feature a ribbon cutting, light refreshments, vendors, and a photo area. The Department invites the community to bring their dogs to the ceremony to celebrate the opening of the permanent dog park. The dog park is open seven days a week from dawn until dusk. Funding for the park was provided by Mayor Joe Kalmick's discretionary fund.



## MCGAUGH PICKLEBALL COURT

On Friday, October 7th the City of Seal Beach completed painting of a new pickleball court at McGaugh Elementary School on Bolsa Avenue. The new pickleball court is an overlay on top of an existing tennis court that utilizes the existing tennis net. The pickleball court lines are yellow to remain distinguishable from the existing tennis court lines.

The victim was over 500 feet offshore, and Chris used a paddle board, and once reaching the victim, she would not cooperate and stay on his board. Chris used all of his waterman skills to get the victim and the paddle board safely to shore.

Shark Lab were on the beach doing a stingray study. Over the last 30 years the Seal Beach Marine Safety Dept. has assisted with stingray studies using our trucks and jet skis.




## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT UPDATES

- A revised Accessory Dwelling Unit ordinance was adopted by the City Council on October 10, 2022, with the second reading scheduled for October 24th. The revised code addresses comments and findings of inconsistency from the State Department of Housing and Community Development.
