
## CELEBRATE LIFE. LIVE DRUG FREE.



# CITY CLERK

- At its Regular Meeting held on October 24, 2022, Mayor Kalmick and Members of the City Council proclaimed October 23-21, 2022, as Red Ribbon Week and presented the Proclamation to Julia Lynch, Unit Commander, Southeast County Young Marines.
- At the October 24, 2022, City Council meeting, Mayor Kalmick and Members of the City Council proclaimed November 11, 2022, as Veterans Day and encouraged staff and residents to recognize the valor, courage, and sacrifice of our veterans through appropriate ceremonies, thoughts and prayers throughout the community and the nation.
- On October 25, 2022, Mayor Kalmick and Members of the City Council issued a Certificate of Recognition to Alpha Structural, Inc., in honor of their 30th year in structural engineering and construction business, serving residential and commercial property owners in the Los Angeles and Orange County areas.
- At the time of this publication, the November 8, 2022, General Municipal Election is E-10 (Election Day minus 10 days) in the City of Seal Beach.

## **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

- Met with California Housing and Community Development staff for continued consultation on necessary modifications to bring the Housing Element to certification. Additional analysis is being performed to demonstrate financial viability of sites and provide guidance for new zoning standards. New policies and programs will also be introduced to incentivize housing development, pursuant to direction given by HCD. As a further challenge, the County has withdrawn their support for housing development at the Sunset Aquatic Marina. The Housing Element included 144 units at that site, which will now need to be relocated. Information on the Housing Element is available on the City's website.
- A scoping meeting, which is a part of the process for the Old Ranch Country Club Environmental Impact Report (EIR), is expected to be held in late November or early December. The meeting is one of the opportunities for the public to provide input on the environmental analysis necessary for the EIR. Further information will be available on the City's website in the near future.
- A Parklet Council Subcommittee meeting was held on October 20th, with good participation, particularly from the Main Street business community. The Subcommittee provided additional direction to staff on a revised parklet program.

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CONTINUED

• Community Development will present a revised short-term rental program to the Planning Commission on November 7th. The action is an amendment of the Municipal Code which currently prohibits short-term rentals, therefore the Planning Commission can recommend as presented or suggest changes, which will be presented to the City Council at a later date for consideration. Changes to the Municipal Code related to short term rentals were considered necessary due to two recent appellate court decisions that declared prohibition of short-term rentals in the coastal zone are a violation of the Coastal Act.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICES**

 There are currently 1,191 users registered for the Senior Transportation Program. The program is available for Seal Beach residents ages 60 years and older and consists of a pre-fixed shuttle route and Yellow Cab Taxi service. # MARINE SAFETY UPDATES

- We continue to have warm weather and mild surf. We had a small south swell arrive last week which gave us surf in the 3-4 foot range.
- Our lifeguard towers on the south side of the pier have been pulled back to allow for the start of the sand berm construction. The construction is scheduled for three weeks. The north side towers will be pulled back later this week.
- On 10/26/22 we hosted the US Coast Guard maritime symposium where agencies that have marine rescue capability get together and go over any muli-agency responses in the last 6 months.
- We have hired a new Aquatics Coordinator to supervise pool lifeguards. We are looking forward to her start in the next couple of weeks.
- Marine Safety held CPR training for all City Staff to stay up to date on CPR life saving techniques.





# SAND BERM PREPARATION AND TOWER RELOCATION

In preparation for the sand berm, Public Works staff removed the surf towers from the beach to clear the way for the winter sand berm. The towers were temporarily relocated to the 8th and 10th Street beach parking lots until the berm is taken down.

Public Works staff installed a french drain, replumbed the new drinkers and laid gravel around them at Zoeter Dog Park to prevent dogs from getting muddy. The sandpile was restocked so that visitors can fill in any holes their dogs dig up. Finally, a retired fire hydrant was refurbished for Zoeter Dog Park. The decorative hydrant will be installed prior to the Dog Park's grand opening on October 26th.

# **UPCOMING UTILITY BILL INSERTS**

The next billing cycle will include a drought awareness bill insert with customer utility billing statements. In addition to drought awareness, the insert will highlight the landscape and outdoor device rebate programs offered by Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC). ## I-405 MAINTENANCE AGREEMENTS

Staff has entered discussions with Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) and Caltrans on new freeway maintenance agreements. These new maintenance agreements will replace older, outdated agreements between the City and Caltrans regarding maintenance, repairs, and future replacement of all parts of Seal Beach Boulevard bridge over the I-405 freeway. Items to be agreed upon include the future maintenance of concrete roadway surface, striping, sidewalks, lighting, security fencing, bridge structure, and graffiti removal to name a few. Most of these items will be the responsibility of Caltrans to maintain, however, there will be some items where the City will be responsible for future maintenance. These items will be discussed and brought to City Council for consideration.



## LEISURE WORLD METER VAULTS

The renovation of a deteriorated water meter vault located in Leisure World that provides water to College Park West has been completed. The project included the installation of a new aluminum access hatch, MAG meter, and feeder valves. The fault is one of two that are scheduled for renovation, the second vault will be completed at a later date.

# I-405 RAMP AND ROAD OPENINGS

On Friday, October 21st, OC405 and Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) reopened the I-405 southbound off-ramp to Seal Beach Boulevard. That marks the fifth and final I-405 ramp closure within the City where no more ramp closures in Seal Beach are expected. The overall I-405 widening project is still tracking a target substantial completion date of September 2023, less than a year away from now. The re-opening of North Gate Road is expected to occur during the weekend of October 28th to October 30th. At that time, Leisure World residents will be able to access Leisure World from North Gate Road again.

# STREET SWEEPING DOS AND DON'TS



# DOS

- Allow extra following distance when driving a vehicle behind a moving street sweeper.
- Use caution when passing a moving street sweeper.
- Remove items from the curb on sweeping days.
- Trim back branches near the street to prevent trees and equipment from damage.
- Bicyclists: ride carefully and be aware of sweeping activity near bike lanes.
- Drivers: give street sweepers plenty of room and only pass when safe to do so.

# **DON'TS**

- Follow a street sweeper closely. Airborne dust may make visibility difficult. Small rocks may get kicked up by the rotating brooms.
- Rake or blow leaves into the street. Piles can clog gutters and drains and may result in flooding during heavy rains. Sweepers are also not designed to pick up large piles of leaves. (Piles also become road hazards).
- X Ignore 'No Parking' signs posted for street sweeping days. You're putting yourself at risk of being ticketed or towed.
