

Beach Cleanup Efforts

Recent rains have resulted in high levels of debris washing up on the Seal Beach shoreline. Public Works beach crews and many volunteers from various organizations have made significant progress on cleaning the beach after the latest rains. High tides and high levels of surf have compounded the level of debris washing up, adding to the clean-up efforts. The Public Works team has been working during low tides to facilitate debris removal, and placing piles off the shoreline to haul off when tides are higher. Large and heavy debris are removed first, and then efforts are concentrated on medium sized debris, and lastly small and fine particles. Larger debris consists of pallets, tires and the like, while medium and fine debris consist of landscaping materials, bottles/cans, and smaller items. Sections of the beach are closed when needed to safely work in designated areas. Crews have been working overtime to restore our beach and have made significant progress.

Lampson Avenue Well Maintenance

The Seal Beach Water Department is currently providing maintenance to the Lampson Avenue Well. The 500 HP drive motor has been removed and serviced, including: new bearings, reconditioning of stator windings, a new space heater, balancing, and load testing. The well pump has been pulled, inspected, and serviced. The 1200 foot deep well has been video logged to inspect subsurface conditions and the louvered well casing. This well is one of the City's most recent, and was drilled and installed in 2008/2009. The Lampson Well has a 24 inch stainless steel well casing and has an estimated yield of 4,000 gallons per minute.
