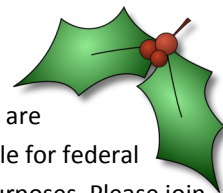

Holiday Décor Safety Tips

OCFA would like to remind everyone to be safe this holiday season when decorating inside and outside the house. Putting up lights and candles and holiday decorations can be fun. But, safety is no accident and everyone needs do their part in staying safe.



Lit candles are dangerous and should never be left unattended. If you are unable to watch candles, you should use lights instead. Holiday light sets come in so many different colors and shapes and can make any home look cheery.



The more lights you use, the more you'll need places to plug them in. Make sure you use a surge protector and don't overload your electrical outlets.



Decorate with materials that don't catch fire easily. Look for the decorations that are clearly marked "non-flammable" or "flame-retardant".



If your family celebrates Christmas and you use a real Christmas tree, remember to keep it watered and away from any heat sources like a fire place or heat vent. That way the tree doesn't dry out faster and accidentally catch fire.



Don't block exits with decorations. In the event of fire, people need to have a clear, easy way to exit each room in your home.



Use caution when climbing and using ladders. Never use the top rung as a step. Make sure all rungs/steps are free of slippery materials, and make sure the ladder is placed on even ground.
