

Striping of Adolfo Lopez Drive

On February 10, 2018 the City completed striping of Adolfo Lopez Drive near the Seal Beach Police Station, Public Works Yard and Animal Care Center. By converting traditional stalls to angle parking, the City was able to add 30 additional parking spaces. After completion of the project there are now 95 total spaces on Adolfo Lopez Drive. This project was an example of a successful partnership with Farmers & Merchants Bank, the Seal Beach Animal Care Center, and the City that has resulted in improvements that will not only benefit volunteers and visitors of the Seal Beach Animal Care Center, but our business community as well.

Sewer Main Repair

A recent sewer pipe break on Adolfo Lopez Drive resulted in an emergency repair and emergency bypass pumping. Fortunately, the leak was spotted by the City's Public Works crews very early and did not result in any sewage discharge into waters or storm systems. Crews were dispatched to protect the storm water system, repair the pressurized sewer main, and perform emergency bypass pumping. During the work, Public Works employees managed the Adolfo Lopez Pump Station, and traffic control was provided to allow for motorists and emergency vehicles.



Concrete Replacement on Main St.

The Public Works Department addressed trip hazards and completed general concrete repairs on Main Street last week during the early morning hours. Repairs take place over two days, with removals the first day and concrete placement on the second. On Main Street, special attention is given to protect businesses, pedestrians and property. Repair sites are carefully sectioned off to allow continued access for pedestrians and shops during the process. Crews always enjoy working around the public, and this jobsite brought many visitors who were grateful for the City's proactive efforts to mitigate potential trip hazards and maintain our sidewalks.
