Disaster Preparedness Tips

Make a Family Disaster Plan

Discuss how to prepare for and respond to a disaster. Plan to share responsibilities and work together as a team.

- Consider special needs for elderly or disabled family members, children, and pets.
- Choose meeting places outside your home and outside your neighborhood. Discuss what to do in an evacuation, and plan multiple routes in case of road closures.
- Choose an out-of-state contact person who can relay information to and from everyone in your household.
- Register for AlertOC, Orange County's emergency notification system, to receive information during and after an emergency.
- Enroll in CPR and first aid classes so you can take care of yourself and your family while you wait for first responders to arrive. Click here to register for CPR & First Aid classes through the Seal Beach Recreation Department.

Create Emergency Supply Kits

Your emergency supply kits should have enough supplies to last you and your family for at least three days.

- Make sure your family kit is portable in case you need to evacuate.
- Consider individual and family needs.
- Include supplies for your pets.
- Create smaller, portable kits for your car and workplace.

Prepare Your Home

Identify and find solutions for any hazards in your home.

- Bolt or brace water heaters, major appliances, bookcases, and other top-heavy furniture to wall studs.
- Anchor or brace overhead fixtures such as lights and ceiling fans.
- Use flexible connections where has lines meet appliances.
- Secure televisions, computers and other electronics.
- Secure or relocate heavy pictures or mirrors over beds and furniture.
- Know where and how to shut off gas, water and electricity.

New Generator in Pump Station #35

The Public Works Sewer Division recently installed a new generator for the Old Town District Pump Station #35. This small generator provides backup power to charge the batteries needed to start the backup engines, run the control panels, station lights, and safety equipment, such as blowers. The unit replaced an older model, which had become difficult to provide maintenance and service to due to components becoming obsolete. Replacement was identified in the Seal Beach Sanitary Sewer Management Plan, which outlines many maintenance activities mandated by the State and other authority sources to ensure sewer systems are being managed and operated according to standards.

yards of sidewalk over three locations. As the location was a "one-way" street, Public Works Crews worked with street sweeping days and times to lessen the impact of construction on residents. Sidewalk replacements will continue in the months ahead with the cooler weather, as it provides better conditions for concrete curing.

Water Department

The City of Seal Beach Water Department has been in the process of exercising mainline water valves in Leisure World. In doing so, the water operators came across an 8 inch gate valve that needed to be replaced. The valve was cut in and back in operation, and the Water Department will continue to complete the valve exercising program in Leisure World.





Solar Cross Walk

Aiming to keep pedestrians safe, Public Works Streets crews installed an eco-friendly solar cross walk at Bolsa and Silver Shoals Ave. The sign works in unison through radios installed in the unit, to light up both signs as traffic approaches on either side. Using an infrared style button, hand motion will signal the lights that a pedestrian is present; LED lights will then notify motorists. These units were installed on existing posts, aiding in installation.

Save Our Beach Clean-Up




