SEAL BEACH POLICE ARREST SUSPECT IN MARINA DRIVE SHOOTING

Seal Beach, CA – The Seal Beach Police Department has arrested a suspect in connection with the shooting that occurred on Marina Drive on Thursday, August 21, 2025.

On Wednesday, August 27, 2025, officers arrested Angel Alcozar, 23, of Oxnard, in connection with the Marina Drive shooting. Detectives, working closely with regional law enforcement partners, were able to identify Alcozar as the suspected shooter through a combination of witness statements, surveillance video, and investigative leads developed in the days following the incident.

Alcozar was arrested on suspicion of the following charges:

- PC 245(a)(2) – Assault with a firearm
- PC 246 – Shooting at an occupied vehicle or dwelling

He has been booked into the Orange County Jail. The investigation remains ongoing, and detectives are seeking to identify additional victims who may have been targeted during the incident.

“Thanks to the hard work of our patrol officers, detectives, and our law enforcement partners, a dangerous individual has been taken off the streets,” said Michael Henderson, Chief of Police for the Seal Beach Police Department. “We are grateful no one was physically injured during this incident, but we know the impact of gun violence affects our entire community. Thank you to all of the community members who provided information that aided in the capture of this suspect.”

The Seal Beach Police Department would like to thank the West Cities Police Communications dispatchers, the Orange County Auto Theft Task Force, the Oxnard Police Department, and the Ventura County Sheriff’s Office for their assistance in this investigation.

Request for Public Assistance

The Seal Beach Police Department is asking anyone with information about the shooting or potential additional victims to contact the Seal Beach Police Department.

As part of this ongoing investigation, detectives are specifically seeking to identify a possible victim or witness observed on available surveillance footage. The individual is described as a White male, in his 20s or 30s, bald, and wearing tan/green military-style clothing.

Investigators are asking for the public's help in locating this individual so officers may speak with him about what he may have seen or experienced during the incident. Still images from surveillance footage are attached to this release.
