




Do you feel the Seal Beach Police Department responds to calls for service within a reasonable amount of time?



How often do you visit the public parks in Seal Beach?




Does your neighborhood have too many, too few, or about the right number of public parks?






How well are the streets in your neighborhood maintained?




Overall, how clean is your neighborhood?




How congested is the traffic in Seal Beach?
